

Vocabulary Inference Prediction Explanation Retrieval Summarise	 To use simple organisational devices to write about real events, recording these simply and clearly. Form lower case and capital letters of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another. Use spacing between words that reflects the size of letters. Punctuate most sentences with capital letters, full-stops, question marks and exclamation marks where they apply; use commas for lists and begin to understand the purpose of inverted commas. Write sentences with some experimentation with ambitious vocabulary Use coordinating conjunctions (or and but) to join clauses. Use subordinating conjunctions (when, if, that, because, so) to join clauses. To use simple past and present tense mostly correctly and consistently, including the progressive aspect ('he is/was running') Segment spoken words into phonemes and represent these by graphemes, spelling some correctly and making plausible phonic attempts at others. To write in a variety of different styles about real events, recording these simply and clearly (including newspapers, diaries, letters and fact files)






