

# Should Holy books be treated differently to other books?



### Lesson sequence

### **Concept Links/Prior Knowledge**

<u>In Reception children learn: The ritual wudhu and themes of cleanliness, the</u> need to be prepared, the importance of water in desert climate where Islam originated

<u>In Year 1 children learn:</u> To remember the order of prayer for Muslims and recognise words and symbols and know what they mean.

<u>In Year 2 children learn:</u> To know how stories in a selected tradition are inspirational for believers

To know the different things that are different between the main religions.

## Sticky learning

#### New Knowledge

To know why some books are special and that religious books have extra significance.

To know the names of Holy books special to religions.

To know some of the importance of the Bible for Christians and know how it is used.

To understand the structure of the Bible and look at some of the stories from both the New and Old Testament and discuss how they are used as religious teachings and why. To know what believers might learn from the significant texts/writings.

To know how to respect books.

To know the Qur'an is the Muslim holy book and why what it means to Muslims and to know how and why it is treated with respect.

To know that the Qur'an is written in Arabic and why the writing within is so important to Muslims (the word of Allah) and why the pages are decorated with patterns from nature.

### **New Skills**

Think about different forms of expression through close examination of different Holy texts, their stories and the lessons we learn from them.

I can ask important questions about the practice of faith and compare some different possible answers.

Ask important questions about different faith practices and compare some answers.

To reflect on the different ways religious people believe you can worship God.


