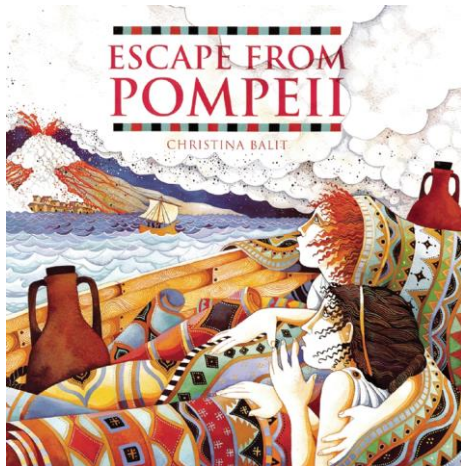

Features – Headline, Name of reporter, Opening sentence/ paragraph (lead), Body, Third person, Past tense, Formal language, Facts, Paragraphs, Direct speech, Reported speech, Columns, Image and Caption.
Structure – Headline, Byline, Lead, Body, Tail.

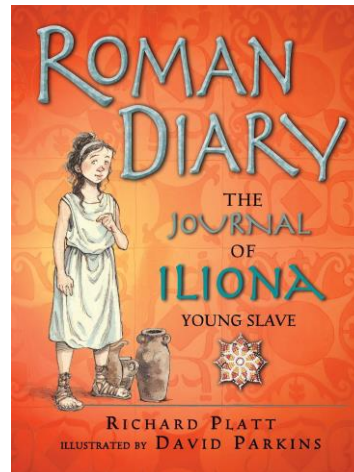
Roman Diary: The Journal of Iliona

Purpose – to inform

Audience – KS2 Readers (aged 7-9)

Features – Chronological order, First person, Past tense, Time connectives, conjunctions, Closing statement, Paragraphs, Descriptive language, Feelings, Emotive language.

Structure – Title, Introduction, Main body paragraphs, Conclusion.



One sided argument-

Purpose – to persuade

Audience – KS2 Readers (aged 7-9)

Features – Introduction, Facts, Emotive language, Rhetorical question, strong conclusion, present tense, conjunctions, Third person, Impersonal voice, Formal tone.

Structure – Start with a question, Opening statement, Argument for/against, Conclusion.
