Dear Parent/Carer,

I trust that this week's newsletter finds you well. Such is the nature of Grimsdyke School, I have a lot to share with you in this weeks newsletter.

### Library and IT Suite Extension...

Thank you to all those parents who have joined me over the past week for the tour of the new facilities that we now have available for the children. I hope you enjoyed seeing what we have created and that you are hearing some wonderful things from the students about their time in both the Library and IT Suite.

### Award winner...

Firstly some great news, last week Mr Godfrey attended the annual Harrow Schools P.E. Conference where all of the P.E. Leads come together and look at the provision across the Local Authority. At this conference Mr Godfrey was awarded the Sport and P.E. Leader of the Year Award. I am acutely aware of the work that Mr Godfrey does in the background for all of the events, activities and experiences here at Grimsdyke School, so it is wonderful that he has been recognised for this. On behalf of the staff, students and parents I want to congratulate Mr Godfrey on this wonderful accolade.

### Parent Consultations...

Next week is the first opportunity for parents to discuss the progress of their child in school – Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> and Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October. I hope you have all taken the opportunity to register a time to meet with the class teachers via Arbor. Much of this first consultation will be based on discussions about settling and setting goals for the end of the year. I would also encourage parents to enquire about the different ways in which they can support their child at home.

We will be opening the gates for collection slightly earlier than normal at 3.15pm to support the beginning of the evening. Parents should only enter the school building through the main doors from 3.30pm.

### School Values (SCORE)...

Since the beginning of the year we have continued to roll out our School Values (SCORE) that were designed in partnership with the Student Council last year. Every class now has a large display poster to refer to as well as individual character profiles. The values have been implemented into the assembly plan for the term, included within classroom learning experiences and are being used in conversations between adults and children across the school.



This week the value focus in assembly was "opportunity". During their time at Grimsdyke School there are plenty of "opportunities" to engage in a range of different activities that are either in addition to the curriculum or part of it. A great example of this is learning in general. The opportunity to learn in a supportive and caring environment where each child is recognised for the skills and abilities that they have is one that should be fostered.

## Class Representatives...

Over the past two weeks teachers have been discussing the different roles that students can play in the development of the school. Roles such as; Student Councillor, Playground Pals, Reading Ambassadors, Eco Warriors, Healthy School and Junior Travel Ambassadors just to name a few, all contribute to different aspects of the school and offer a great opportunity for the students to get involved. In addition to this the Year Six students have all been presented with the opportunity to apply for a Prefect role, as part of this process they were required to write an application. As a result our Year6 students have given us an mammoth task, as we received 78 applications.

## Hot School Meal Provision...

The Hot School Meal provision continues to run successfully, since the beginning of the year we have been averaging 480 meals per day, this has increased to well over 500 in the past two weeks. The percentage of pre booked meals has also increased over time, which in itself is a wonderful development considering it will become compulsory after the October half term break.

## Attendance Headlines...

School attendance since the beginning of the year has remained positive at 97.1%. Over the past two weeks it has become more challenging with some sickness going around but has remained above the expected standard of 95% - sitting at 96.8%.

Year Group Attendance over the past two weeks looks a little like this... Well done to Year Three who just squeezed past Year Five for the "Attendance Champions" spot.

# YEAR 1

This week and next, our focus story is 'Peace at Last' by the late and famous children's author, Jill Murphy. We have looked at repetition, sequence and story mapping. The children are excited to change elements of the story to make it their own. In Science we have been looking at the 5 senses so the book fitted perfectly with its focus on sound. The children recognised Baby Bear from the book 'Whatever Next' that they studied in Reception. It is lovely when children make connections between their learning.

For maths, we are started to use mathematical terminology to compare numbers such as greater than, less than and equals. They then went on to use the symbols  $<$   $>$  and  $=$ . Many children can form beautiful numbers but at a closer inspection, we realised they are beginning them in the incorrect place. Please continue to practise the correct formation of numbers where possible.

In history, children have been looking at houses from different time periods. We went on a local walk to look at features of houses. Maybe you can ask your child to point out a detached house, semi-detached house, terraced house, flat, bungalow etc.

## YEAR 2

The children have been working extremely hard over the first few weeks in Year 2. We have been continuing our work on famous people and it has been great to see how eager they are to learn about lots of different people.

In English, we have been focusing on fact-files. The children have been recognising the features and using this knowledge to write their own. They have written one for Emily Davison and also used their home learning research to write another about Nelson Mandela. We have been really impressed with the children's writing.

We have been artists in Year 2 and have been working on our own versions of LS Lowry's 'Cityscape'. Last week, the children learnt about perspective and experimented with mixing colours. Using this knowledge, they were able to sketch and paint their background. This week they designed their buildings and added matchstick people to their work. In science, the children have been learning about microhabitats. We visited our bug hotel on the school field to find some of its visitors.

In Geography, we have been looking at the globe. We have been locating European countries using the index of an atlas to find page numbers and understanding how to use co-ordinates.





In Art, we used a variety of sketch pencils to create pictures of woolly mammoths from the Stone Age. We practised creating light and dark areas using cross hatching and stippling.




# YEAR 5






## Geography-
