End of year writing expectations

Pupils should:

- Vary the length of sentences within a single piece of writing.
- Use punctuation consistently (capital letters, full-stops, commas, question marks and exclamation marks).
- Use a range of conjunctions (including: when, if, because, although) to write extended sentences with more than one clause.
- Present their work neatly.
- Identify possible improvements to grammar and vocabulary.
- To use a dictionary to check spelling and definition of a word.
- Be able to use a range of features in their writing confidently that include rhyming words, alliteration, simile and onomatopoeia.

How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth - Instructional Writing

Purpose – to inform

Audience – Owners of a woolly mammoth

Features – Bullet pointed list, imperative verbs, time adverbials, numbered instructions

Stone Age Boy – Diary Entry

Purpose – to inform

Audience - Child from the Stone Age

Features – Past tense, varied sentence types, 1st person, feelings/thoughts/facts, informal language, date, 'Dear Diary', Introduction, Main Body, Sign Off

A Rock is Lively - Poetry

Purpose – to entertain

Audience – KS2 children who enjoy poetry

Features – Alliteration, rhyming words, simile, onomatopoeia, metaphor, verses/stanza
