Concept Links/Prior Knowledge

EYFS - To know that we are all different, but in some ways the same. To know the meaning of unkind words.

Year 1 - To know what bullying is. To know how it feels to belong to a family and care about the people who are important to me.

Year 2 - To know the difference between the definition of bullying and someone being unkind on one occasion. To know how to get help if I am being bullied or if someone is being unkind to me. To identify different members of my family.

Sticky learning

- I know how to calm myself down and can use the 'Solve it together' technique
- I know what it means to be a witness to bullying
- I know what to do if I see someone getting bullied
- I know some ways of helping to make someone who is bullied feel better
- I know that witnesses can make the situation better or worse by what they do
- I know how I can show appreciation to my family/friends or the people who care for me

New Skills

- Explain why it is important to feel valued.
- Describe different conflicts that might happen in family or friendship groups & how words can be used in hurtful or kind ways when conflicts happen.
- Tell you how being involved with a conflict makes me feel & offer strategies to help the situation.
- Tell you about a time when my words affected someone's feelings & the consequences.
- Try hard not to use hurtful words
- Give & compliments and know how this feels.
