Concept Links/Prior Knowledge

EYFS - To know that we are all different, but in some ways the same. To know the meaning of unkind words.

Year I- To know what bullying is. To know how it feels to belong to a family and care about the people who are important to me.

Year 2 - To know the difference between the definition of bullying and someone being unkind on one occasion. To know how to get help if I am being bullied or if someone is being unkind to me. To identify different members of my family.

- -Tell you how being involved with a conflict makes me feel & offer strategies to help the situation.
- -Tell you about a time when my words affected someone's feelings & the consequences.
- -Try hard not to use hurtful words
- -Give & compliments and know how this feels.
