Message from Headteacher:

Dear Parent/Carer,

It has been another fantastic week at Grimsdyke School with a wide range of learning experiences being presented to the students across the school. Since the beginning of the term we had maths quizzes, Barnet FC on site, a trip to a WW2 Bunker, NFL Filming, the return of African Drumming, a mixed cricket tournament, Junior Choir, UNO and Chess Clubs, CREW on site, a meeting for Eco Monitors and Interschool Cross Country. Even though it is a short term there is plenty more to come that will support the wider development of the students including a HMS Guitar Festival, Interschool Netball Tournament, 2nd round of the Primary Maths Challenge, Girls Football, Whipsnade Zoo visit, World Book Day, British Museum Visit, Junior Citizenship trip and Science Week to name a few.

In the week prior to the half term we will be celebrating Children's Mental Health week. The theme this year is "My Voice Matters" It is about empowering children and young people by providing them with the tools they need to express themselves because when we feel empowered, there's a positive impact on our wellbeing. Children who feel that their voices are heard and can make a difference, have a greater sense of community and self-esteem.



With this in mind it is important to share with you that Mrs White and I presented a strategy plan for Mental Health and Wellbeing at Grimsdyke School to the Governing Body this week. This is a whole school offer that we intend implementing as our contract with Place2Be comes to an end. It looks at a range of different provisions that will come in three separate waves of support. We are excited to get this provision in place as a way to support the mental health and wellbeing needs of our students and I look forward to sharing it with you in due course.



School attendance is not only important for your child's progress and attainment, but also for their overall wellbeing, wider development and their mental health. In reviewing the attendance for the Autumn term and meeting with a range of parents across the course of the week it is evident to see that illness was the biggest factor impacting attendance at school. As a parent myself I appreciate and understand that it can be difficult to decide when to send your child into school if they are feeling unwell.

If you think your child is slightly unwell, please remember that it is usually safe for your child to attend school with a mild illness such as a cough, cold and runny noses. However if your child has a temperature of 38 degrees or above then they should stay at home. The <u>NHS has produced some guidance</u> on this for parents.

When you register your child at school you have a legal obligation to ensure that your child attends school on a regular basis. This means that your child must attend school every day it is open unless they are too ill to attend. If this is the case then it is important that you share the reason for absence with the school through the <u>attendance@grimsdyke.harrow.sch.uk</u> email address.

Next half term we will be hosting the second of our two Parent Consultation evenings, the focus for these will centre around your child's progress, current attainment, next steps and attitude to learning. As previously, the bookings for this will be made available through Arbor. You will be notified in advance of when these will be open. I encourage you to make the most of this opportunity to hear about your child's progress

CURRICULUM IN ACTION

RECEPTION

Over the past couple of weeks, the children have really been enjoying our new topic about Space! Last week we read the story 'Man on The Moon' by Simon Bartram. The children enjoyed sequencing the story and thought of questions they wanted to ask Bob. We also learnt about real life astronauts and watched some video clips from inside a space station.

This week we have been reading 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. The children have imagined going to the moon and have written lists of things they would pack for their journey.

In maths we revisited number bonds and practised writing addition number sentences using the correct symbols. This week we moved onto Mass and Capacity. The children have been practically exploring the weight and volume of objects in a range of different activities. Thank you for bringing in junk modelling materials. The children have had a great time building rockets and space buggies too!

Just a quick reminder that we will be having a space theme day on Thursday 8th February. Please send your child in dressed up on that day.

In our history lesson this week, Thomas Aker, the Toy maker, visited Year 1 and shared lots of information about Victorian toys. We explored and tried out a range of toys, finding out how they worked and what materials they were made from. It was great to interact with all the toys we have been learning about in history.




Year 2

Over the last few weeks, we have been doing lots of great learning! In our topic 'The Far East' the children have continued to look at what life is like in China and compared their own school life to a child's in China. In maths, the children have continued to work on money by looking at different word problems where they had to work out how much change they would get.


In English, we started our new book called 'Willow Pattern story' and the children have been looking at settings. In Art, we finished our work on the artist 'Yayoi Kusama' and created our own versions of her pumpkin artwork inspired by her love of polka dots and bright colours. We then started to look at Japanese art and created some 'Japanese cherry blossom tree' pieces.

In computing, the children continued their work on programming and got to use their command skills by using Beebot's to follow different algorithms.


Below are a selection of pictures from this week's learning.



Here is just a small sample of what Year 3 have been learning about this past fortnight...



The children continued their science topic of Magnets and Forces. Developing our knowledge of non-contact forces, we first predicted what would happen when similar or opposite poles of a magnet are brought together before testing our theory. Some children had never experienced the push or pull of a magnet before and had a lot of fun feeling its effects!



During the children's practical maths lesson this week, we used lollypop sticks and straws to understand how remainders are created when dividing. The children were then able to write the number sentences to match the arrangements they had created.

<u> Art – Egyptian Art</u>

This week, we have been exploring different techniques with oil pastels and using these to create a pharaoh in our own image. This has linked with other areas of curriculum, most notably, English and history. Within English, we have been exploring the book 'Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Caroll. Watch this space for fantastic narrative pieces!



Building brilliant bridges!



The children have been collaborating over the last few weeks in their teams to design and build their very own bridges. They have been learning about the history of bridges, materials-how these have evolved over time as well as construction and uses. By working to a design brief teams then designed a bridge to ensure:


It must allow traffic to pass in both directions It must be strong It must be attractive Should allow on the river boats to pass through underneath Will it allow pedestrians to walk across? What type of bridge will it be?

The final designs were fantastic and the children all really enjoyed their learning!

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How does the Earth move in the Solar System?






This week the children have been investigating the Earth's movements in the Solar System. They create a model to demonstrate not only how the Earth rotates but also revovles around the sun. Children also research extra details such as how we get the seasons and important invisible lines such as the axis and Equator.



In art, Year 6 children evaluated and analysed some of Jean Michel Basquiat's and Banksy's artwork Followed by designing a mood board to help them create their own Banksy inspired art.



In computing, Year 6 children will be creating websites based on curriculum topics. They will identify what makes a good web page and use this information to design and evaluate their own websites using Google Sites. Throughout the process children will pay specific attention to copyright and fair use of media, the aesthetics of the site, and navigation paths. Here are some examples of their websites so far.



In PE, Year 6 children have started a football unit; the young players are developing their dribbling, passing, and shooting skills, with a strong emphasis on teamwork. This unit promises to be the ultimate goal-scoring adventure!
