#### Message from Headteacher:

Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope the final newsletter of this half term finds you well. It's hard to believe that the half term break is already upon us. I would like to say that it appears the weather has turned a corner but perhaps I might need to hold off on that, at least it appears both brighter in the mornings and evenings, which is a good sign that longer days are coming our way.



This week we celebrated Safer Internet Day 2024 (SID 2024), SID is an internationally recognised awareness day that promotes the safe use of the internet. The theme for this year was "Inspiring Change". We discussed the different aspects of internet safety as part of our Computing Curriculum so it is wonderful to see the level of understanding the students have when talking about their "lives online". For that reason, we need to make sure that they are as prepared as possible for all of the different things that they might encounter. Interestingly when talking with the students in both Lower and Upper Key Stage Two it dawned on me the difference between my early experience with the internet

and theirs. Many of us never had the internet when we were growing up whereas our children have not known life without it.

For those parents who feel they might not be up to speed with some of the technology that our children are interacting with, the <u>National College</u> produce some wonderful guides that highlight a range of safety tips for various elements of technology including; Smartphones, Location Tracking, various online games and being kind online. For reference, I have attached an example of one of these to the newsletter about "Respect Online" as well as the SMART Rules that we promote in school through the Computing Curriculum.

With Safer Internet Day in mind and the impact that technology has on our day to day lives, I have a favour to ask the parents. We are in the process of designing some wall art for our new Computing Suite, we are looking to create a timeline of key events in the development of technology. Anything from the birth of the internet to the release of the first Mario Brothers game. It is wonderful to see that many of the year groups have increased their attendance percentage in comparison to the second half of the Autumn term and over half of the year groups are meeting or exceeding the DfE expectation of 95%. ## SPORT

In January, our ever growing partnership with the NFL UK continued as they visited us on a chilly Monday morning. We were asked if we would like to help out with filming a social media video, which will be used as part of their promo for the NFL International Games which will take place in London later this year. 15 children from Y6 were asked to help and they took on various roles as NFL players to 'recreate' famous past moments from both regular season games and London games. The shoot took around 2 hours and the children are very excited to see what the final project will look like, when it is uploaded to the NFLUK Youtube.

At the end of January, 19 children from Y5/6 competed in the X-Country festival being hosted at Shaftesbury Playing Fields. The children had to complete two laps each around the whole park. In Y5, Annabel managed a super 2nd place to qualify for Finals Day. Jessie was hampered by losing her shoe to the mud on a couple of occasions, but she finished strongly alongside Sukhrit. The boys in Y5 put in a strong performance, which Aahad, Avi, Jayden, Atharv and Arman all finished inside the top 15. Moving on to Y6 and Ottilie led the girl's race from start to finish, whilst Alara also cracked the top 10. Sareena, Laura and Kamila followed shortly after to ensure the Y6 girls team qualified for finals day. The Y6 boys were last to go on what was now a very muddy and slippery field. Lewis led for the majority of the race but was pipped in the home straight, to finish an amazing 2nd place. Kiaan, Charlie, Sebastian, Aarush and Shradan all completed it without any stoppages and ensured that the Y6 boys team also qualified for the finals day.



## CURRICULUM IN ACTION

### RECEPTION

We have had an exciting few weeks in Reception! As we come to the end of our topic 'To Infinity and Beyond!', we have read 'Aliens Love Underpants'. You may have heard the news that some aliens took our pants from Reception. We spent the day investigating and looking for clues around school. Thankfully all the pants were returned the following day.

This week we have read the book 'Look Up' by Nathan Bryon. Inspired by the character's interest in a meteor shower, we learnt about how some stars form constellations and tried making some of our own. In maths we learnt about odd and even numbers and doubling numbers to 5. The children explored these maths concepts using practical activities and how they are found in everyday life including ladybirds, butterflies, dominoes.

Thank you for those who were able to join us in celebrating 'National Story Telling Week'. It was such a treat to have such a variety of stories read by different adults and the children loved seeing some of their family members in class.

The children have loved learning about space and we've had a fantastic time rounding it off with our theme day. It has been great to see all the different costumes and home it is a day they will remember. Thank you for all your continued support with the children's learning and we wish you all a happy and safe half term break.

Last week we visited Kol Chai Synagogue in Hatch End. It was nice to see all the things we had previously learnt about in our R.E lessons about Judaism. We even got to taste some of the items!



In science we have continued our unit on materials and now applying our knowledge to various investigations. Last week our aim was to find out which material was best for driving a toy car on. We found out that the best was <u>'wood'</u>. It was the smoothest and strongest.

We cannot believe that we are half way through year 2! The children have done so well and we are proud of all of their progress.

Over the last 2 weeks, we have been learning about multiplication in maths, learning how to retell the Willow Pattern story using lots of description in English and thoroughly enjoyed creating our own Willow Pattern Plate in art. The children have been continuing their gymnastics lessons and have been learning how to cartwheel and do forward and backward rolls.

We are also so impressed with their shoebox habitats, thank you for all of your efforts with these.






The children have had great fun creating their very own Roman shields. After looking at some real-life examples, the children first came up with their design using typical Roman decorative elements as well as adding their own personal touches. We then transferred the designs to a larger template and painted them using block colour technique.



In Geography, we took a detailed look at an OS map of our local area, to see if we could find evidence that the Romans had been here before us! The famously long and straight Watling Street, was easy to spot: starting in Dover and passing through Londinium to Wroxeter.

#### Science – Water Cycle

In Science, we have been learning about the different States of matter! The children spent the first number of lessons looking at what solids, liquids and gases are and their properties. We took a closer look this week at evaporation and condensation including the heating and cooling points that affect these changes in water and naming the different stages of the water cycle. We made mini water cycle bags to demonstrate this and the children have enjoyed coming into the classroom daily to see the changes to their water cycles.



#### History – Canopy jars

In History we are continuing our learning journey in Ancient Egypt, learning about mummification. In this process, the lungs, liver and stomach were placed in Canopic jars. The children got be dirty and creative while having fun to create their very own Canopic jar. They had to Paper Mache a tub with tissue paper and make an Egyptian Head of their choice out of clay. It was really exciting to see everyone enjoy this activity and push themselves in the skill of sculpting.

#### Moving to the beat: African drumming



As part of our music curriculum, for the past few weeks the children have been learning all about the origins of African drumming. Drums play an important role in every aspect of African life, including the physical, emotional and spiritual. African hand drums are played to communicate, celebrate, mourn and inspire. The children have been immersed in learning song, beats and the art of playing the drum!

#### Amazing Aztec Art



The Aztecs created many forms of art, including jewellery, knives, pottery, statues and mosaics. Mosaics are pictures, or patterns, created from small pieces of materials. The Aztecs used a sacred mineral called turquoise to make their mosaics and the children have been creating their own patterns using vibrant colours to create mood boards whilst annotating what they have observed.

## Traffic and parking is everyones responsibility. Do the right thing!

Year 6 children used the technique of hot seating to step into the shoes of the legendary Rosa Parks during her bus journey that changed history. Through this thought-provoking activity, children explored Rosa's feelings, experiences, and motives, enabling them to empathise with the struggles she faced during that momentous day. They delved into Rosa's bravery, determination, and unwavering spirit as she made history by refusing to give up her seat.



Through hands-on activities and engaging discussions, Year 6 children used fossils to unlock the secrets of how living things have evolved over millions of years. Year 6 students followed Fossil collector Mary Anning's footsteps, examining her findings and drawing parallels to their own fossil discoveries.





In Re, Year 6 created a leaflet explaining humanist beliefs. The leaflets covered topics, including humanist principles, the importance of critical thinking, and the celebration of human potential. The children used their research and communication skills, ensuring it was an informative and eye-catching read.
