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
# Message from Headteacher:

# **Parent Consultations -**

- All parents attending appointments including those who have a 3.30pm appointment, must enter the school

- Please take time either prior to or after your appointment to view your child's learning in their tray that will be out for you to look through
- Once you have finished your appointment you should return to the front of the school to exit the building, as all gates will be closed.

### Fit4Life - Harrow Launch

Schools across Harrow have joined with various partners across the Borough to create the Fit4Life Harrow project. This is in response to data that is telling us that children in Harrow are not faring well with their health and fitness. The latest figures show that nearly one fifth of children entering Reception classes across the borough are overweight or obese.

Harrow Fit4Life have devised a response to this in the form of a Charter, which sets out ambitions for schools and parents to work together on various elements. As a sign of our commitment to this charter, a copy of this will be displayed in the front entrance to the school is available for you to view below. In short it is encouraging both schools and families to consider a number of things, which include;

- healthy choices around physical activity
- healthy foods and less sugary snacks
- increased awareness and action to improve oral hygiene
- having up to date vaccinations
- talking to each other about how we feel on a regular basis

- \* White/Grey socks (ankle/knee length)
- \* Tights (black/grey/red)
- \* Sensible black shoes (no boots)
- \* Long hair must be tied back, plain hairbands may be used
- \* Children should not wear jewellery unless it is of religious significance. Small stud earrings only may be worn.

# **CURRICULUM IN ACTION**

# RECEPTION

Welcome back to the second part of the Spring Term. This half terms topic is called 'Once Upon a Time'. Last week we read the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. The children had lots of fun getting in role to retell the story. They planted beanstalks and made magic beans. The children learnt the parts of a plant and what a plant needs to grow. In maths the children learnt about comparing and measuring length and height. One morning giant footsteps appeared in our classroom and the children enjoyed measuring them too!

This week we read 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. The children made story maps and wrote wanted posters using adjectives to describe Goldilocks. In maths we learnt about subitising 9 and 10.

This week we started of our maths week by counting forwards and backwards to 50. We then moved onto representing numbers to 50 using tens and ones.












In R.E. this week, the children had the opportunity to handle some real artefacts used in the Jewish religion. They learnt how some of these are used during the Friday Shabbat meal.

# Wildlife on the go: Whipsnade Zoo visit







The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Whipsnade Zoo which is the UK's largest zoo and one of Europe's largest wildlife conservation parks. It is home to 3,626 animals, many of which are endangered in the wild. The majority of the animals are kept within sizeable enclosures; others, such as peafowl, Patagonian maras, and rednecked wallabies, roam freely around the park. Despite the weather, the children enjoyed exploring different parts of the park and immersing themselves in a workshop where they were able to discuss the environmental impact of plastics in our oceans and the devastating consequences for marine life. It was a fantastic day out for all the children and staff!

# Authentic chocolate making: Aztec chocolate bars



As part of our art curriculum, the children have been busy researching Aztec patterns, symbols and different geometric designs to inspire their chocolate making adventure. After using their research to inspire their design of authentic wrappers, the children then chose their ingredients to make up their very own chocolate bars. Aztec chocolate, which they called xocolatl, was mostly an upper-class extravagance, although the lower classes enjoyed it occasionally at weddings or other celebrations. The whole year group enjoyed melting and placing their chocolate into moulds before adding their own toppings in and waiting for them to set. The results were incredibly delicious!

# YEAR 6

Year 6 children visited the Harrow Junior Citizenship Scheme. They took part in a number of different workshops. TfL Citizens taught children the tools for safe and responsible travel on public transport. That included journey planning tips and the benefits of active travel. The London Fire Brigade workshop helped children to understand fire safety in the home, how to prevent fires and what to do in an emergency. The London Air Ambulance work shop taught children basic first aid and recovery positions.



Year 6 children explored the capabilities of a camera that can be used to record video. Once they became familiar with their device, the children experimented with different camera angles, considering how different camera angles could be used for different purposes.



In maths, Year 6 children investigated calculating percentages of amounts using digit cards. Children arranged some 0-9 digit cards to make as many different percentage calculations as they could.
