### Sticky learning

#### New Knowledge

- Learn about the history of Balinese gamelan beleganjur music and Balinese kecak chant.
- Explore different ways of making sounds for a gamelan performance.

- Listen and identify repeating cycles in Balinese music.
- Reproduce the core melody, gong, and beat of the kecak chart.

### Balinese Gamelan

In this topic we will explore the music of Bali through two dynamic musical forms: gamelan beleganjur - a lively kind of percussion music originally performed during battle - and the kecak vocal chant.

Gamelan beleganjur is lively and often performed at religious ceremonies. It translates as 'walking warriors', was originally battle music, and is played in moving processions.
