

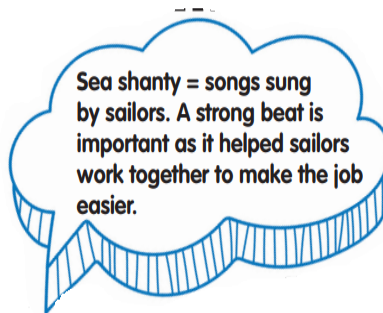
Music—Sea Shanties

| Harmony | 2 or more pitches are played at the same time |
| Accompaniment | A music part that supports other musical parts |
| Bass note | The lowest note played |

Hey, ho! Nobody home is over 400 years old and would have been sung at Christmas time.

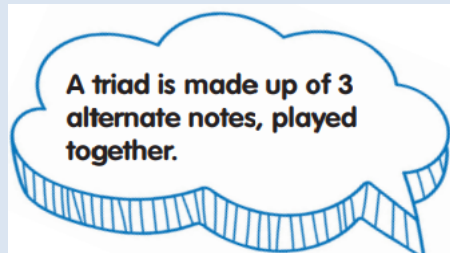
What shall we do with the drunken sailor?

How to play a triad ...
 Play a note, miss a note, play a note, miss, play.

Major triads (sound 'happy') → C major = C E G

Minor triads (sound 'sad') → A minor = A C E
 D minor = D F A

A rhythm grid can help you create and remember your ideas. Choose a shanty, draw a grid and write down your body percussion accompaniment ideas. It might look something like this.
