

What makes buildings special? (Sikhism/ Sikh Dharm)


A Gurdwara is a big, special building where people who follow Sikhism go to pray and be together. Imagine it as a place where everyone is like a family, and it doesn't matter who you are—everyone is treated the same. The Gurdwara, has a **community**, which means that people help each other and spend time together. It's like when you share your toys with friends or help someone carry something heavy. **Equality** means everyone is just as important as everyone else. In the Gurdwara, everyone is treated with love and respect. They eat food together, called **Langar**, where anyone can join. Lastly, **kindness** is very important. Just like when you say kind words to your friends or help someone who falls down, in the Gurdwara, people are always kind and helpful to one another.


So, the Gurdwara is a place that teaches us to be together, share, and be kind to everyone!
