British Museum: The British Museum is one of the world's greatest, showcasing objects from prehistoric to modern times. Design a magnificent mask inspired by objects from the Museum in a free, drop-in event. Choose a topic from ancient Egypt, the Aztecs, ancient Greece, Persia, Peru or Japan.
